# CALL FOR STUDENT POSTERS DEADLINE TO SUBMIT AN ABSTRACT IS TUESDAY, MARCH 31, 2015

The DIA welcomes abstract submissions for the Student Poster Program at the DIA 2015 51<sup>st</sup> Annual Meeting.

The Student Poster Program is an opportunity for eligible students to present research results to a diverse group of scientific professionals who are actively involved in the discovery, development, and life cycle management of pharmaceuticals, biotechnology, medical devices, and health care related products.

### Selected student poster presenters will receive:

- One complimentary meeting registration to attend the DIA 2015 51st Annual Meeting for one listed author
- A maximum of three nights' hotel accommodations (room and tax only) at the DIA assigned hotel
- One round trip, coach airline ticket to Washington, DC
- Up to \$50 per day reimbursement for meeting-related expenses for a maximum of three days
- One-year student membership to DIA

Accepted abstracts will also be published in the Annual Meeting Final Program and posted on the DIA website. Additional publication opportunities may be available in other official DIA publications.

# **STUDENT ELIGIBILITY**

- Individuals must be either
  - an undergraduate or graduate student who can document that they are enrolled in a Bachelor's, Master's, PharmD, PhD or equivalent degree-granting or certificate granting academic program in an accredited academic institution, whose content is consistent with the mission of DIA.
    Students must be actively enrolled to complete a minimum of 12 undergraduate hours or 9 graduate hours annually in their academic program.
  - a recent graduate who has completed a degree granting program meeting the same requirements listed above, within the institution's 2014 academic year, may submit a student poster by providing documentation that they were a student when the research was performed.
- The presented research must have been conducted with an academic institution.

- All submitting authors must complete an <u>online student</u> <u>verification e-form</u> by the submission deadline as part of their application. Abstracts submitted without a student verification form will not be considered.
- Fellows, residents, post-doctoral scholars, and working professionals are not eligible; however, they are invited and encouraged to submit to the DIA 2015 51st Annual Meeting Professional Poster Program.
- Past DIA Annual Meeting or EuroMeeting student poster presenters are ineligible.
- Abstracts submitted for presentation must not have been presented or published previously.

# **GENERAL SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

- 1. Abstracts must be submitted through the DIA website (www.DIAHome.org) by Tuesday, March 31, 2015.
- 2. A student may submit only one abstract.
- 3. Abstracts may not refer to specific brand names.
- 4. Abstracts will be reviewed, and authors notified of results during the week of Monday, April 20, 2015.
- 5. Abstracts should address one of the interest areas (see next page) represented at DIA 2015 51st Annual Meeting.
- 6. If an abstract is accepted, one author or coauthor must attend the DIA 2015 51st Annual Meeting to present the abstract during the Student Poster Program on Monday, June 15.
- 7. Only one author is to be identified at the time of submitting the abstract. This author will be the lead regarding all communications related to the submission. Additional authors may be added after the review process is complete.

# **ONSITE REQUIREMENTS**

- The attending author or coauthor is expected to be present at the DIA Student Forum. *Date and time to be announced shortly.*
- Student Poster Program will be held on Monday, June 15, 2015.
- Presenters must prepare a poster for onsite presentation.
- Each author will be scheduled for a 2- to 3-minute presentation of their work, including questions and answers from the judges; therefore, attendance at DIA 2015 51st Annual Meeting is required. Student presentation of posters must be autonomous.


#### **REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION FOR ALL ABSTRACTS**

If you are proposing an abstract on behalf of the author, as the submitter you will not be asked to disclose. However, should the abstract be accepted, the author will be informed that he/she must respond to the Participant Disclosure to participate in the Annual Meeting Program.

 Content delivered at the DIA Annual Meeting is distributed. All submitters and authors must agree to the DIA Speaker Authorization for Use of Presentation Materials in order for the abstract to be a part of the Annual Meeting Program.
